**Formula adjusted, standardized to suit performance parameters

Directions

Rehydrate the contents of 1 vial aseptically with 10 ml sterile distilled water. Mix well and aseptically add to 1000 ml of sterile, molten, cooled (45-50°C) MRS Selective Agar Base w/ Clindamycin-Ciprofloxacin (DM3071). Mix well and pourinto sterile Petri plates.

Specimen Collection and Handling

For food and dairy samples samples follow appropriate techniques for handling specimens as per established guidelines (1, 2, and 3). After use, contaminated materials must be sterilized by autoclaving before discarding.
