

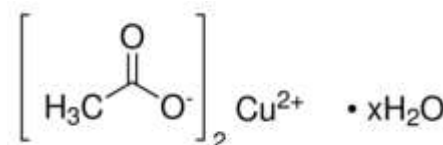

DANGER
